



# Borneo Tour

## *Sumatra and Kalimantan*

Cleveland District State High School students travel to Sumatra and Kalimantan biennially to learn more about the land, the fauna and the people in Indonesia. Students travel to Sumatra to view and meet one of Indonesia's most endangered and endearing animals, the orangutan. They trek into the jungle to explore the rich diversity of the rainforest and to understand the importance of protecting the unique ecosystem.

After seeing the lush jungles of Sumatra, students visit Tembak Village in Kalimantan and immerse themselves into the culture of the local Dayak tribe. They assist the small school by helping to maintain its upkeep through painting and building. They also attend to the children and run small lessons. Students learn about the impacts of the environment and the destruction of the jungle due to palm oil plantations. The Borneo tour offers students a clear insight into how our world is rapidly changing and the need to protect earth's unique flora and fauna.
