As an International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma student you are recognised as an independent thinker and learner, and as such you are well prepared for university.

Be inspired and supported

At QUT, you will continue to be challenged by your academic program, and be provided with support and development opportunities to help you discover your place in the world and make your mark.

Entry to QUT

Entry to most QUT courses is based on academic merit, however some courses have additional entry requirements such as an audition. Published selection rank thresholds for courses can be used as a guide for the selection rank you will need to gain entry to your chosen course. Check the course information at qut.edu.au/study

Your completed IB Diploma score will be converted to a selection rank by QTAC (see table below). Only completed IB Diplomas can be considered for entry to QUT degree courses. However, an International Baccalaureate Career Certificate and incomplete or failed IB Diplomas are considered for entry to QUT diploma courses.

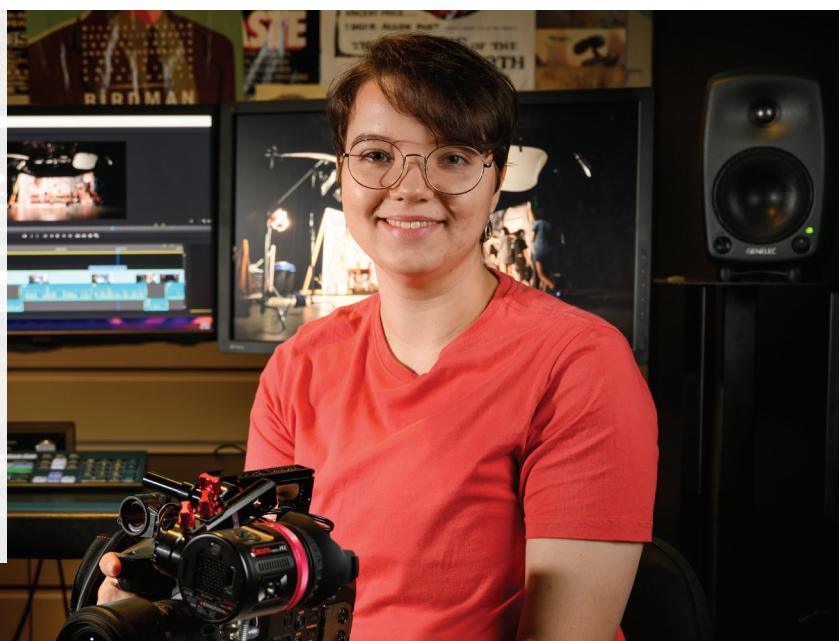

Film, screen and new media graduate

As an IB graduate, I chose to study at university to further my education, increase my employability and meet different people. I chose QUT for the location, international opportunities and the hands-on, industry-focused approach.

Offer guarantee

If you achieve a selection rank equal to or higher than the offer guarantee for your chosen course, you are guaranteed an offer regardless of the threshold. You'll still need to include the course as part of your QTAC preferences and meet all other entry requirements. A small number of courses are excluded. Visit qut.edu.au/study/offer-guarantee

Year 12 early offer scheme

If you are a Queensland Year 12 student you may be eligible for an early offer on your last day of school based on your early Year 12 results. The scheme is available for specific single and double degrees in a range of study areas. Find out if you're eligible at qut.edu.au/study/early-offer

Year 12 subject scheme

If you have successfully completed certain subjects during your IB Diploma, you can receive a selection rank adjustment, making you more competitive for entry. The scheme applies if you are completing Year 12 in 2023 and applying for entry for Semester 1 or 2, 2024. The adjustment is automatically calculated by QTAC. Assumed knowledge and prerequisites

QUT has an assumed knowledge scheme for most courses. This means you don't need to have studied specific subjects at school to apply for the majority of our undergraduate courses; we assume you have the minimum level of knowledge in certain subject areas. If you don't have the assumed knowledge we strongly recommend a bridging course otherwise you may struggle with your studies. Visit qut.edu.au/assumed-knowledge

Bachelor of Education single and double degrees, as well as the Bachelor of Science Advanced (Honours) degree, have prerequisite subjects that you must complete to gain entry to the course. Visit qut.edu.au/prerequisites

International students with a completed IB Diploma will meet the English language proficiency requirements for QUT courses if they have completed any of the following with a minimum grade of 3 for HL subjects or a minimum grade of 4 for SL subjects: English A: Literature, English A: Language and Literature or English B.

Advanced standing

You can apply for advanced standing (credit) based on your completed IB Diploma studies, after you've accepted a QUT course offer. Depending on your course, you can receive advanced standing up to the equivalent of a full-time semester, allowing you to either accelerate your degree or reduce your workload in some semesters. START QUT

Advance your studies and test drive university and different study areas with the START QUT program. Study one or two QUT units during Year 11 and Year 12 alongside first-year students. There are no tuition fees and you can receive a QTAC selection rank adjustment to help you get into your chosen uni course. Find out more at qut.edu.au/startqut
