This funding will be used to

- Build a high capacity staff with expertise to lift student performance through differentiation.
- Achieve 85% A-C results in school-based assessment in Junior Secondary.
- Achieve 98% of Year 12s graduating with a QCE or QCIA.
- Achieve 100% of Year 12s graduating with a qualification or certificate.
- Improve student engagement and attendance.

Our initiatives include

- Design a Junior Secondary Certificate of Education to drive and celebrate student achievement.
- Implement school-wide moderation processes to support teacher judgements.
- Implement a co-teaching inclusion practices model to improve differentiation.
- Implement evidence-based support and intervention programs to assist 'at risk' students.
- Further shape our successful Senior Secondary program to incorporate four pathway options: Intensive Academic, Tertiary Options, Work Readiness, and Life and Work Skills.
- Systematically case manage students to guarantee successful pathway completion.
- Improve the learning environment in classrooms and playgrounds to create a culture of inclusion, improvement and success.
- Continue to refine teaching and learning practices for all staff through active participation in professional learning opportunities.
- Work collaboratively with relevant internal and external agencies to support positive and productive learning environments for improved learning outcomes and successful career pathways.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Employ additional teachers to facilitate literacy and numeracy support for students, build staff capacity and improve student engagement \$290 000.
- Employ four additional teacher aides to provide literacy and numeracy support for students \$180 000.
- Employ a teacher aide and a Community Education Counsellor (CEC) to work with targeted indigenous students, their families and our community partners \$46 000.
- Employ an Industry Liaison Officer to support students with the transition to work \$45 000.
- Employ a Guidance Officer assistant and an Engagement Officer to support Deputy Principals in case management of special education students and 'at risk' students \$73 000.
- Purchase additional resources to assist with staff development in literacy and numeracy and provide supplementary targeted learning resources for students \$99 000.
