

Welcome to Cleveland District State High School Instrumental Music Program 2024

Returning students from year 8-12:

Based on last year's performance/attendance students will be placed into ensembles according to their instrument and level of instruction. Some students will be unsure about continuing with music, which is quite a normal reaction after a break, when everything seems a little overwhelming. We believe that being in the program is enormously beneficial to your student's schooling, which has been demonstrated by some of our best results each year coming from students who also study Instrumental Music.

Once we are in a routine this usually passes, so please persist and encourage them to attend their lessons and rehearsals. Ensemble lists and times were sent as an email last year. We will place a list up on the Performing Arts notice board upon return.

Resource Fee

The Instrumental Music Department at Cleveland District High school has developed into a leader in music education and has a proud history of excellence. Your student will experience the very best in teaching and learning, equipment and facilities, and will be involved in a wide variety of performances. Instrumental music is fun, engaging and has been proven to be highly beneficial for brain development and academic success.

A \$100 fee is required for the year and will be invoiced to parents early in the year (please do not pay until invoiced). This is consistent with the Student Resource Scheme. If your student chooses to leave the program at any stage in a semester, you will not be eligible for a refund for that semester, but any future semesters can be refunded if applicable. This is because funds have been committed and resources purchased by the Department. This policy encourages your student to see out the semester, as the performances traditionally happen at the end of this period, and this is the major highlight for our students and is the greatest reward for their efforts. If your student does decide to leave the program, parents will need to communicate this in writing to the relevant teacher.

The fee assists with the cost of resources required for the Instrumental Music Program.

- Purchasing of ensemble and lesson repertoire (one piece costs between \$60-\$300)
- Maintenance and use of music stands, music practice rooms, technical equipment (amps, tv's, lights, computers etc), Maintenance of larger more expensive school owned instruments (eg tuba –\$8500, baritone sax \$7000, set of timpani \$20000)
- Purchase of larger expensive school instruments to keep up with the demand of enrolment.
- Smart music access for lessons, ensemble and from next year private practice at school.
- Cost of hiring of trucks and buses to performances and camps.
- Subsidy of camp and ensemble workshop costs.
- Photocopying costs for ensemble and lessons.
- Computers to run SmartMusic for individual use at lunch times and in spares.
- Entry fees to festivals and competitions (sometimes \$120 per ensemble)
- PA hire and technician fees for concerts.
- Concert fees for showcase concerts
- Purchase of furniture (Music cabinets, chair and stools etc).

Instrumental Music as a QCAA Recognised Study Advice to Schools and Teachers

The Department's Instrumental Music curriculum has been approved as a QCAA Recognised Subject, allowing year 11-12 students to obtain 1 QCE credit point when completing each of levels 7-10 of the curriculum. The conditions around which students may access these points are as follows:

Time requirements: weekly contact time required for this program includes 1 x 1hr ensemble rehearsal and 1 x 30-35min group lesson, as well as regular home practice. Each level will comprise of a minimum of 55 contact hours across 37 weeks. No different from what you are already doing.
